The institution has consistently worked towards nurturing young minds by providing quality education and encouraging intellectual growth. In addition to academic excellence, the college places strong emphasis on the holistic development of students through cultural, sports, and co-curricular activities. As a progressive institution, it remains committed to shaping responsible and capable citizens. Guided by the vision of ***“Bringing Transformation through Education,”*** the college strives to deliver education that is productive, efficient, and aligned with the aspirations of its students and society.

BRIEF OVERVIEW OF THE COLLEGE:

(A) EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES AND COURSES OFFERED

1. UNDERGRADUATE LEVEL

Rashtriya Uchcharitar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA)

The **Choice Based Credit System (CBCS)** and the semester system were introduced from the academic session **2013-2014** by the State Government under **RUSA** to make undergraduate education more student-centric and competitive at local, regional, national, and global levels. Under CBCS, students have the flexibility to choose subjects from a wide range of courses offered under **B.A., B.Sc., B.Com., and BCA**, as recommended by the UGC. To ensure a holistic curriculum, elective papers were introduced from the **2016-2017 session** along with core papers in each discipline. In addition, special emphasis has been placed on **Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC)** and **Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)** to strengthen practical and skill-based learning. The college received approval to introduce the **Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA)** programme in **2012-13**, with classes commencing in the **2019-20 session**. Furthermore, from the **2021-22 session**, **B. Voc. courses** in *Hospitality and Tourism* and *Retail Management* have also been introduced.

2. POST-GRADUATE LEVEL

The college has been offering Postgraduate programmes in **English, Political Science, and History** since the academic session **2007-08**, and in **Hindi, Economics, and Commerce** since **2017-18**. Over the years, student enrolment in these programmes has steadily increased, and the departments have consistently produced commendable academic results.

3. ADD-ON COURSES

Keeping in mind the cut-throat competitive scenario in employment sector, the college has been successfully running **4 'Add-on Courses'** since **2007-2008** in-

- Functional English
- Fashion Designing
- Marketing Management
- Tourism and Travel Management

(B) INFRASTRUCTURAL FACILITIES

The college has continuously upgraded its infrastructure to provide students with modern facilities and quality learning opportunities. The campus includes an auditorium-cum-library, arts and science blocks, administrative block-cum-examination hall, boys' and girls' hostels (capacity: 90 boys and 105 girls), five computer labs with about 180 computers, eight smart classrooms, a conference hall, canteen, playground, gymnasium, eco-friendly bio-toilets, and a shooting range.

A major milestone in the **academic session 2025-26** was the establishment of the **Innovation and Future Technology Lab (IFTL)** on the third floor of the administrative block. The lab aims to promote technological advancement, research, and hands-on learning among students and faculty. It was formally inaugurated on **22 Dec. 2025** by the Principal, **Dr. Lalita Rawat**.

The college auditorium has also been technologically upgraded with the installation of a **20×10-foot high-resolution video wall** costing approximately **₹20 lakhs**, enhancing presentations, seminars, and cultural events while reducing recurring expenditure on banners and backdrops. Additional improvements include the installation of **snow-guard railing on the auditorium roof** for safe maintenance and drainage, along with relocation of water tanks. These developments were supported by the **Hon’ble MLA Rohru, Sh. Mohan Lal Brakta**.

(C) COLLEGE LIBRARY

- The **college library has 17,573 books** (11,999 textbooks, 1,132 reference books, 2,228 general books, and 455 in the Career Guidance Cell) and a **Book Bank with 1,120 books**. It also subscribes to **5 newspapers, 7 magazines, and 5 journals**, and provides **e-books and e-journals** through the **One Nation One Subscription initiative**.

(D) UNIQUE FEATURES AND BEST PRACTICES

- The **Donor’s Account**, approved by the College Student’s Central Association (CSCA), Parent-Teacher Association (PTA), and students, is a notable initiative aimed at providing **financial assistance to orphaned and underprivileged students**. This collaborative effort promotes transparency, inclusivity, and shared responsibility, while strengthening the institution’s commitment to equal educational opportunities and student welfare.
- The **introduction of a dress code** reflects the college’s emphasis on discipline, unity, and professionalism among students. Wearing blazers instills a sense of responsibility, institutional pride, and respect, while also preparing students for future professional environments.
- The college holds the distinction of having its own **Mahavidyalaya Gaan- “Jai Jai Jai Ho Seema Mahavidyalaya,”** composed by **Assistant Professor Chanchal Thakur (Music Vocal)**. The anthem is performed on all major institutional occasions, reinforcing the college’s identity and spirit.
- The college has been shortlisted under the **Swarn Jayanti Utkrisht Mahavidyalaya Yojana**, funded by the Department of Higher Education, Himachal Pradesh, and has held the status of College of Excellence under the scheme since 20 January 2023.
- The **Centre for Integrated Mountain Studies**, with a focus on the Pabbar Valley and adjoining areas of Shimla district, was established at RVS Government College Seema on 14 March 2023 under the Swarn Jayanti Utkrisht Mahavidyalaya Yojana.
- As part of its initiative to reduce paper waste and promote sustainability, the college has implemented a system of **digital marking of students’ attendance**.
- To instill patriotism and respect for the nation, the **National Anthem** is played every morning at 10:00 a.m., during which the entire college community stands in honour of the motherland.
- The campus is equipped with **Wi-Fi, LAN connectivity, biometric attendance systems, and CCTV surveillance**.
- **Water purifiers and coolers** are available on campus.
- A **sanitary napkin vending machine** is installed in the **girls’ hostel**.

IGNOU STUDY CENTER

The college also hosts a **study centre of the Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU)**, established in **2000**, which currently provides educational opportunities to **249 learners**. The centre is coordinated by **Dr. Rai Singh**. It offers a wide range of programmes, including **Bachelor’s Degree Programmes in Arts and Commerce**, various **Certificate Courses** such as Computing, Tourism, Environmental Studies, Disaster Management, Forest Management, Creative Writing (English and Hindi), and courses related to Human Rights, Labour Development, and Consumer Protection. In addition, the centre offers Diploma programmes in Food and Nutrition, Child Care, and Nutrition and Health Education, as well as a Postgraduate Diploma in Rural Development and Postgraduate degree programmes in English, Hindi, Political Science, and Public Administration.

CAREER COUNSELING AND PLACEMENT CELL

The **Career Guidance and Job Placement Cell** of the College functioned actively during the academic session 2025-26 with the aim of enhancing students' employability, career awareness, and opportunities for higher education. The Cell serves as a link between students and career opportunities through career counselling, skill development, industry interaction, and placement support. It operates under the guidance of the principal and includes a Coordinator, faculty members, and student representatives, ensuring effective outreach and participation.

Major Activities

- The Cell organized **Rozgar Mela / Campus Placement Drives** twice during the session in April and June 2025, providing employment opportunities to students of the college and nearby institutions. In **April**, 150 students registered, 76 qualified the first round, and **8 students** were finally placed. In **June**, 40 students participated, out of which **12** were selected, with salary packages ranging from ₹20,000 to ₹35,000 per month.
- The college maintained a **Memorandum of Understanding** with **Chanakyam Academy**, which conducted coaching for HPPSC, CDS, UPSC, Banking, and SSC examinations. These sessions strengthened students' exam preparation, conceptual clarity, and problem-solving skills.
- The Cell also organized **training and induction programmes** for vocational course students, including BCA final semester students. For B.Voc. students in Retail Management, Hospitality, and Tourism, On-the-Job Training was facilitated after each semester in relevant organizations. Many students secured placements after completing their OJT, highlighting the effectiveness of practical training and industry exposure.
