The IQAC directed the formation of an advisory meeting to deliberate on future plans for continuing teaching activities. Suggestions were sought regarding the implementation of a structured academic calendar and strategies for delivering optimal online teaching to students.

 It was also decided that the sensitization and orientation of students must be done through online mode in the wake of COVID-19 & the awareness drive should be done through social media platform, class Whatsapp groups.

Following suggestions from the IQAC, faculty members formulated a future plan of action for teaching. They proposed conducting online classes through Google Meet and utilizing WhatsApp groups for different classes. Additionally, they recommended disseminating notifications and government directives via social media platforms to ensure effective communication with students.

The sensitization and orientation of students was done by the Principal Dr. B.S Chauhan and the various awareness and sensitization programmes & messages were carried out by the wings of NSS, NCC, Ranger rovers through the various social platforms like Facebook, Whatsapp etc.





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- The classes should be conducted through online mode using various online teaching devices.
- Online classes for various subjects were conducted using platforms such as Google Meet, Zoom app, and WhatsApp.
- 5. The IQAC suggested that the health centre of the college should play pivotal role in providing the health services to the staff members and the students during this tough time of COVID-19. The health cell committee of the college including the staff nurse submit its proposal to buy the medicines, thermal scanners, face shields, face masks, sanitizers and the spray machine for the college.
- During the COVID period, the college health center continued to provide its services. It procured essential supplies such as medicines, hand sanitizers, face shields, and a spray machine, amounting to more than Rs 50,000 in value.
- The IQAC suggested the NSS to prepare
 the plan of action to combat COVID-19
 and asked to launch various sensitization
 and awareness campaign among the
 masses and provide their services to the
 society at large.

Following the IQAC's proposal, the NSS initiated a COVID-19 awareness campaign titled "Announcement on Wheel" on August 11, 12, and 18. Private vehicles equipped with public announcement systems traversed various areas and villages, sensitizing residents about COVID-19 precautions. This proactive approach aimed to educate communities about preventive measures against the virus.

The following agendas were discussed and the following decisions were taken by the IQAC:	The college organized a multidisciplinary international conference titled "A New World Order: Resilience and Reinvention" from December 18th to December 27th, 2020. This
 During the meeting, it was agreed upon to organize a Multidisciplinary International Conference along with workshops, seminars, and upskilling programs for both teachers and students. 	conference was conducted in collaboration with 11 colleges from the state and received technical support from the Science and Management Society, H.P and the Help India Online Foundation. The college hosted a National Level webinar on National Science Day on February 28th, 2021. The women's cell of the college organized a one-week workshop on Digital Literacy from March 1st to March 6th, 2021.
 The IQAC also proposed the development of infrastructure, which includes the purchase of equipment for science laboratories and acquisition of books. 	Following the recommendations of the IQAC, the Department of Geography purchased soil and water testing kits, a rain gauge, wind vane, and a digital anemometer totalling Rs 40,000. The Department of Physics procured experimental equipment worth Rs 3,02,788. The Department of Chemistry acquired equipment for the chemistry lab amounting to Rs 1,07,746. Books worth Rs 28,900 were purchased for the library.
 The IQAC also proposed preparing an infrastructural development plan under RUSA 2.0. This would facilitate the systematic purchase of various items in the near future according to the plan. 	Following the IQAC's directive, the RUSA coordinator prepared an expenditure plan based on identified needs. Proposals were solicited from various departments, and RUSA grants were allocated according to priority under the following categories:

- The statue of Goddess Saraswati was constructed worth Rs 1,80,000.
- A 30KVA solar panel system, costing Rs 24,94,292 was installed in the college to promote energy conservation and contribute to a sustainable environment.
- Cable wire installation for the solar panel was completed, with an expenditure of Rs 94,825.
- Repair and maintenance of the college building, sewerage, and renovation of the playground were carried out in three phases. 60% of the allocated amount has already been spent on these projects.
- Books worth Rs 9,73,666 were purchased.
- Computer tablets worth Rs 24,998 were purchased.
- Seed germinator worth Rs 1,80,000 was purchased by Deptt of Botany.
- Almirahs for books, amounting to Rs 4,99,120, were purchased, along with almirahs for office use, purchased for Rs 72,245.
- Two video conferencing and digital teaching devices, costing Rs 4,69,599 were purchased.

Action Taken Report

The meeting of IQAC was held on 10th February 2021. The following agendas were discussed and the following decisions were taken by the IQAC:

- 1. The IQAC convened a meeting with all faculty members of the college following its reopening. Teaching resumed in offline mode. The IQAC stressed the mandatory observance of social distancing and maskwearing within the college campus and during classes to curb the spread of COVID-19. All forms of gathering or group standing were discouraged to mitigate the risk of transmission. Additionally, adherence the government-issued Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) was advised. To manage the number of students on campus, the IQAC recommended an alternating attendance system based on odd or even days. Furthermore, it suggested the formation of various committees within the college to enforce the SOPs issued by the Government of India and ensure the maintenance social distancing measures.
- The IQAC advised the house examination committee to prepare the plan to conduct House Examination in the first week of March. The IQAC also suggested preparing the plan as per guidelines and S.O.P's of the COVID-19.

On the suggestions of the IQAC, proper social distancing were maintained by the different committees of the college. The time table for the offline classes were started on the basis of ODD/EVEN days i.e.:

1st year: Monday and Tuesday, 2nd year: Wednesday & Thursday 3rd year: Friday & Saturday

The house examinations were successfully conducted from the third week of March onwards. These examinations were administered by respective class teachers at their own levels, strictly adhering to the guidelines and SOPs for COVID-19.

In the meeting, it was decided that the convenors of extracurricular and co-curricular activities viz NSS, NCC, Rangers rovers to conduct their activities as IQAC was of the view that it was need of the hour during the pandemic.
